

This is a summary of the Anthropology bachelor's degree requirements. **You can also access very helpful and individualized information on RAMWeb. This RAMWeb site (see instructions below) provides detailed information as to what courses have been accepted toward your major and what courses you still need to successfully complete the major. Instructions on how to find this DARS audit site follow.** Refer also to the University Catalog to assist with your understanding of the Anthropology degree requirements.

Step one: Go to CSU's home page at www.colostate.edu and click the "Current students (RAMWeb)" link on the right hand side under the more about section. Type in your eName and ePassword in the "Applicants and Current Students: RAMWeb" box on the right hand side of the page. Then click "Log into RAMWeb"

Step two: Click the "Degree Audit Submit - Undergraduate (DARS)" link under the "Records" section in the lower right hand area of the page. Click "run audit." Click "view submitted audits."

Step three: Click the "Anthropology Major" link under the "view link" section. A window pops up displaying your current DARS report. Scroll down. Checks indicate what you have completed and the X's indicates what you have yet to complete. Click on the small triangles on the left to expand the information.

***Anthropology requirement:** Must take either ANTH 100 **OR** ANTH 200. ANTH 100 fulfills category 3C. ANTH 200 fulfills category 3E.

Additional Anthropology requirement: Select twelve (12) credits with at least two prefixes from the following prefixes: ECON, GR (Except GR 210, GR 342, GR 345) HIST, JTC, POLS, PSY, SOC, LB 192 (Social Science sections). ETST (except ETST 430)

CATEGORY 4 DEPTH AND INTEGRATION (5 CREDITS MINIMUM)

Each program of study at the University has specific courses approved to fulfill category 4 and a particular course may fulfill more than one of the subcategories within the program of study.
