

Adams County 4-H Open Riding Guidelines

Riders Under 18 MUST have a parent/guardian sign a Adams County Regional Park Liability Waiver BEFORE mounting your horse.

Riders over the age of 18 may sign an adult waiver before riding.

- Never tie horses to panels, use an anchored pole in between panels to tie horses.
- Remember to leave enough room between horse for you to safely walk around them.
- When riding respect the riders around you.
- Be mindful of your speed
- Remember to observe around you before making quick turns, pace changes or stops.
- Dis Mount a horse who is being stubborn and uncontrollable, ask for assistance from a Present 4-H Leader if you need
- Do not tow horses
- Do not ride double
- There is no barrel racing in the arena, AT ANY TIME
- All Riders during 4-H Open Riding must be a 4-H member or 4-H Horse leader
- If parents, or community members would like to ride, they must wait until the Adult Open riding begins at 6 They must also sign a waiver and pay the associated fees.
- Unruly and disrespectful riders or horses may be asked to leave the 4-H Open Riding by Extension Staff, Regional Park Staff or a Adams County Horse Committee Officer.
