RULES:

All entry cards must display: the department number 870, the listed section number, the class number, and the exhibitor number.

General Rules:

1. Any person may enter. An exhibitor may enter as many horticulture exhibits as desired in any class or subclass provided each exhibit is of a different species, cultivar, color, size or type. All exhibits must remain throughout the show.
2. Each exhibitor must obtain an Exhibitor Number (at the Classification Table) which is to be written on each entry tag. Exhibitors are responsible for correct and proper classification and completion of the entry tag before bringing entries to the Classification Table. (Assistance will be available.) Printed or address labels are recommended on entry tags.
3. Entries accepted in Open Class Crops and Vegetables/Flower Show from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 2, 2012.
4. Judging of exhibits will begin at 1:00 p.m., Thursday, August 2, 2012. Only authorized personnel will be allowed in the judging area.
5. The show will be open to the public Friday, August 3, 2012 and Saturday, August 4, 2012 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Sunday, August 5, 2012 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
6. Exhibits will be released at 5:00 p.m. Sunday, August 5, 2012. Exhibits may also be picked up Monday, August 6, 2012 at teardown from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. The Extension Office and Flower Show Committee will exercise care but will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
7. The show will be judged by the National Garden Clubs, Inc., Standard System of Awarding. The 2007 Handbook for Flower Shows shall govern matters not covered in the Schedule. Only one first place (90 points or above), one second place (85 points or above), one third place (80 points or above), and one or more honorable mention (75 points or above) ribbons may be awarded in each class or sub-class. An accredited judge will sign and date each blue or '90+' ribbon entry tag. The decision of the judges will be final, and they may withhold any award at their discretion.

- 10. *Dahlia* - with attached foliage - Cactus type (incurved or straight) – 1 bloom - Petal tips are curled inward more than ½ the length; straight cactus petal tips are straight or recurved; incurved petal tips are gradually curved inward toward the center.
- 15. *Dahlia* - with attached foliage - Semi-cactus type – 1 bloom - Petal tips are twirled 1/3 to ½ the length; bases of petals are broad.
- 20. *Dahlia* - with attached foliage - Pompon and Ball types – 3 blooms - Fully double flowers either globular or ball shaped; petals are fully curled inward the whole length.

SECTION 55: CLUB COMPETITION DISPLAY

DISPLAY

1. A DISPLAY is exhibited for artistic effect, as well as cultural perfection. A CLUB COMPETITION DISPLAY must consist of seven to ten different cut specimens, each in a separate container. One or more members of a club enter specimens into the class to complete the club's total exhibit.
2. Pre-registration is recommended (see flower show schedule). Space allotted is 30" wide on the table. The exhibitor is responsible for staging, such as using different elevations, labeling, underlays, etc. Exhibitor places own exhibit.

CLASS:

5. Perennials and/or Biennials

AWARD: Eligible for Club Competition Award



RULES:

All Entry Cards Must Display: Department Number 870, Listed Section Number, Class Number, and Exhibitor Number.

DESIGN RULES: (Also see General Rules in Flower Show Schedule)

1. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit. This includes fresh and/or dried plant material. Schedule may determine type and control of its use.
2. An exhibitor may enter as many classes in the Design Division as desired unless schedule limits the number of entries, but only one exhibit per class.
3. A design entered in competition must be the work of only one exhibitor and that exhibitor's name must appear on the entry card.
4. Advance registration required for all exhibits in Design Division II. Call Design Division Advance Registration Chairman, Rose Persichetti, 303-449-7355 by Saturday, July 21, 2012 deadline for registration in all Design Classes, Division II. The class with unlimited entries is the novice design (Section 75 Class 1); all other classes have four entries. Unless otherwise stated all designs will be staged on 1/2 of a six foot table. Tables will be covered and skirted in white. Height for all designs (except small and miniatures) is not limited.
5. The exhibitor need not have grown the plant material used. Fresh fruit and vegetables (which if cut must be sealed in some manner to discourage insects) are considered fresh cut plant material.
6. Naturally dried or treated material is allowed in all classes, except those eligible for the Tricolor Award, or where otherwise designated. No artificial plant material is permitted.
7. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted in the Design Division.
8. Bases, underlays, etc. are allowed in classes unless otherwise stated. Frames, open columns, and/or pedestals, if used, may be incorporated into the design unless otherwise stated.
9. A card of interpretation may accompany each exhibit with plant material named. All containers and accessories should be marked with owner's name.
10. Use of backgrounds provided by the exhibitor is permitted in all designs unless otherwise stated in the schedule
11. These same rules apply in Division III, Section 106. Advance registration is not required for youth designs and designs will be staged in space available.
12. The official American flag and other national flags are not permitted within any design in a Standard Flower Show. Furthermore, the use of any official national flag as an underlay, background, skirting, draping, etc., is also prohibited throughout all divisions of the Standard Flower Show.

SECTION 60: SPECIAL DESIGNS

CLASS:

1. "TAKE FLIGHT" A collage not to exceed 24" in any direction. Staged to hang flat on a free standing white panel 30" wide x 80" tall. A first place design in this class is eligible for the FLOWER SHOW CHAIRMAN'S AWARD, a gold ribbon rosette. See HB page 197.
5. "MADE FOR FLIGHT" – An assemblage to be viewed from all sides and staged on a table 18' high by 24" round draped to the floor in white. A first place design in this class is eligible for the ADAMS COUNTY FAIR AWARD. See HB page 197.

SECTION 65: TRICOLOR AWARD

- Section 65 Classes 1, 5, and 10 are eligible for the Tri-Color Award. In this section, all plant material must be fresh. Weathered wood is not permitted in any form. (Note: a frame(s) if used must be subordinate.) Background staging will be white to off-white.

SECTION 70: DESIGNER'S CHOICE AWARD

- Section 70 Classes 1, 5, and 10 are eligible for the Designer's Choice Award. In this section, the exhibits are to be of the designer's choice of plant material with or without other components. Background staging will be white to off-white.
