

**FALL WEBWORM**  
*Hyphantria cunea*

- Natural range -** Across North America from southern Canada to northern Mexico. Introduced into parts of Europe, northern China and North Korea.
- Species affected -** Broadleaf trees. In the western USA, alder, ash, choke cherry, cottonwood, maple, willow and various fruit trees are attacked.
- Type of damage -** Skeletonizing of foliage
- Symptoms -** Presence of brownish colored tents, damaged foliage and colonies of larvae inside tents. Damage usually appears from mid to late summer
- Importance -** This is a common pest of roadside trees and could affect ornamental trees in urban areas.
