

Larimer County Horseback Riding Program (Riding Hours Log)

1. Every Horse Project member in Larimer County is eligible to participate.
2. The horse(s) used must be a designated horse project animal and have a current Horse ID form on file at the Extension Office.
3. The 4-H member keeps a record of their riding hours (Trail, Arena, Clinics, etc.) and submits these hours to their leader by October 1. If using more than one horse, the hours are combined. Record only the hours you are mounted on your horse. Do not record time grooming or watching events.
4. The program will run from October 1 – September 30 for the current 4-H year.
5. Please use the Riding Hours Log Sheet.

6. Each leader will turn the total number of hours per individual horse/rider combination into the Extension Office – Attn: Riding Hours by October 10.
7. Recognition will be given to individuals who log 50 hours or more.
8. The hours logged each year will carry over to the next project year.
9. After accumulating 1000 hours, the rider will receive a 1000 hour plus sweatshirt and a gift certificate. The sweatshirt will be awarded once; gift certificates more than once if the rider is still in 4-H and participating in the program.
