County youth enrolled in Clothing Construction (see "Modeling For Fun"), (exception: Sewing for Others) Decorate Your Duds, Recycled Clothing, Creative Sewing, Heritage Arts and Leathercraft are eligible to participate. Participants model wearable garments they have made for themselves in these projects. Contestants may model in more than one unit.

All garments modeled by participants must also be entered and judged in the appropriate clothing division. Leathercraft and Heritage Arts projects shall be judged in the appropriate departments.

A Champion and Reserve Champion will be designated in each project area and age division (junior, intermediate and senior). An Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be designated in each age division (junior, intermediate and senior). The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion senior contestants will represent the county at the State 4-H Fashion Revue. A senior alternate will also be chosen.

ELIGIBILITY OF GARMENT: Garments made during the current club year in fulfillment of project requirements are eligible for competition. Participation in other (non-4-H) contests does not eliminate them from this event.

"MODELING FOR FUN" -- NEW IN 2011

For 4-H youth not enrolled in a Clothing Project or enrolled in Sewing for Others, but would like to participate in the Fashion Revue and learn how to model, this is their opportunity. Participants may model an outfit purchased at the store for school or a special occasion or an outfit made for them by someone else. The participants will explain in their commentary why they chose this outfit, where they plan to wear it, and how the outfit compliments their style and personality. Youth who enter this category will be able to participate in the workshop and Fashion Revue and learn modeling techniques and confidence on stage.

The same judging guide used for Clothing Projects will be used for this category. Contestants will be split into age divisions (junior, intermediate, and senior), however Senior contestants will not be able to qualify for the State 4-H Fashion Revue.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

A) The Pueblo County Fair Management will use all care possible to insure the safety of the entries. However, under NO circumstances will they be responsible for loss, injury, or damage done to, occasioned by, or arising from any article on exhibition.

B) All articles must be deemed to be suitable for exhibition or can be denied entry by the Superintendents. All exhibits must have been completed since August 1, 2010. (Except quilts - Aug. 2009.) Articles that have been previously entered in the Pueblo County Fair are ineligible.

C) Exhibit must be the product of the exhibitor/group named on entry.

D) Competition is open only to Pueblo County residents.

E) Danish system of judging will be used. All exhibits will be awarded a ribbon. A champion and reserve champion will be awarded in all classes, if merited.

F) A rosette will be awarded to best overall pantry and best overall needle art exhibitors. Division Grand Champions will receive gifts sponsored by local businesses.

G) High Point Awards will be awarded in each division to the high point exhibitors (One point awarded for each blue, champion, and reserve champion ribbon by division).
