



## TYPES OF AWARDS:

Teaching Assistantships--Teaching assistants are paid a stipend in return for services that relate to the undergraduate educational mission of the university. The nature of the services will vary depending on the needs of the department and the skills, experience, or abilities of the assistant. Typical duties are compiling class bibliographies, grading papers, monitoring laboratories, conducting discussion sections, or complete teaching of undergraduate classes.

Research Assistantships--Research assistants receive a stipend for which they are expected to perform any of a wide variety of research related tasks under the direction of a faculty member. Sometimes the work in question may be related to the student's own courses, thesis, or dissertation and it may thus partially fulfill degree requirements.

Support Assistantships---A few assistants are paid a stipend in return for services to various administrative units. Assistants may be assigned to officers like department heads and college deans or they may serve offices whose functions are not strictly academic.

Non Service Fellowship Awards--These are merit based awards funded by the state of Colorado. There is no service requirement and both residents and non-residents are eligible. These awards supplement other forms of financial support.

Fellowships and Traineeships--There are several awards which vary from a few hundred to several thousand dollars. Service or work is not required in return. Awards are competitive on the basis of merit.

## MATERIALS TO BE SUBMITTED WITH THIS APPLICATION

Generally, the supporting documents for the Application for Admission (CS Form 1) (transcripts, letters of reference, GRE/GMAT scores) will be sufficient. However, if there are materials which you feel would have a particularly important bearing on your application for financial support, please include them and list on the front side of this form.
