What is NASTF?

The National Automotive Service Task Force is a not-for-profit, no-dues task force established to facilitate the identification and correction of gaps in the availability and accessibility of auto service information, service training, diagnostic tools and equipment, and communications for the benefit of automotive service professionals. NASTF is a voluntary, cooperative effort among the automotive service industry, the equipment and tool industry, and automotive manufacturers.

Who's Involved?

NASTF is supported by all the prominent national automotive service organizations, including the Alliance of Automotive Service Professionals, Automotive Service Association, Automotive Service Councils of California, Equipment & Tool Institute, National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence, and the Service Technicians Society, to name a few. NASTF is also supported by all the major automakers and many organizations involved in training and support to the service industry, including AC-Delco, ALLDATA, CARQUEST, Ease Diagnostics, Identifix, MCI WorldCom, and Snap-On, to name a few. Altogether, 63 organizations are currently involved in NASTF, and participation is growing.
