2004 Watering Schedule

(Updated April 20, 2004)

Englewood residents will again be asked to observe Denver's lawn watering schedule. As in past years, compliance with this year's schedule and guidelines listed below will be voluntary. If an extra watering day is needed, that will be allowed. If areas of your landscaping are drying out under this schedule, spot watering as necessary may be a better way to keep your landscaping green and still conserve water. Please observe sound water conservation practices.

Mandatory restrictions are always a possibility. If Englewood residents use too much water under the voluntary conservation plan, mandatory measures could be imposed.

Here are the details:

1. There should be no watering between the hours of 10:00AM and 6:00PM due to the high evaporation rates during this period.

2. Days you can water:

Sunday **Single-Family Residential with Even Addresses.**

Monday **No water (except by special permit)**

Tuesday **Commercial, Industrial, Multi-Family**

Wednesday **Single-Family Residential with Odd Addresses**

Thursday **Single-Family Residential with Even Addresses**

Friday **Commercial, Industrial, Multi-Family**

Saturday **Single-Family Residential with Odd Addresses**

Trees and shrubs can be watered by a hand-held hose or low-volume non-spray irrigation any day of the week, but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Flowers and vegetables can be watered with a hand-held hose or low-volume non-spray irrigation on any day, but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Washing driveways and sidewalks is not recommended.

Personal vehicles can be washed at the owner's home with a bucket or a hose equipped with a positive shut-off nozzle.

Remember, Water Department personnel will enforce the requirements in the Englewood's Municipal Code:

Water shall be used only for beneficial purposes and shall never be wasted. . . . Water for irrigation of lawns shall only be used during the hours and in the manner specified by the City Manager or designee. No spray or sprinkler shall be placed in a position to throw water on a public walk, driveway, street or alley while irrigating adjacent areas, except insofar as may be absolutely necessary.
