## Request to Add Option in the Major in Food Science and Nutrition

A request by the Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition to add the dietetics option (online) in the major in food science and nutrition (M.S. degree program) was approved. The recommended effective date, subject to approval by Faculty Council, is Summer Session 2008.

### **Request to Change the Name of the Department of Speech Communication**

A request by the Department of Speech Communication to change the name to Communication Studies was approved by a vote of 8 yes, 1 no. The recommended effective date, subject to special action by Faculty Council and approval by the Board of Governors, is Fall Semester 2008.

### **Requests to Change Name of Major in Speech Communication**

A request by the Department of Speech Communication to change the name of the major in speech communication (M.A. degree program) to communication studies was approved by a vote of 8 yes, 1 no. The recommended effective date, subject to special action by Faculty Council and approval by Board of Governors and the Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHE), is Fall Semester 2008.

### **Bachelor of Arts and Sciences Degree**

The committee resumed its discussion of possibility of creating a Bachelor of Arts and Sciences (BAS) degree for students who have two or more majors that include majors that would have earned a B.A. or B.S. if completed individually.

The committee agreed on the following:

1. That it preferred to align the conditions under which one could earn two baccalaureate degrees sequentially (the existing second bachelors degree requirement for students who return after completing a bachelors degree to earn a second one in a different major) with the requirements that would be necessary to earn two degrees concurrently. Those requirements would include:
  - a. At least 27 unique credits in each major
  - b. Completion of category 4 requirements for each major
  - c. Completion of a minimum of 30 credits beyond the credits required to complete the first degree (i.e., a minimum of 150 credits)
2. That students who completed two majors that spanned the arts and sciences but did not meet the requirements for two degrees would be given the following options:
  - a. Choosing either a B.A. or a B.S. (by stipulation which major was their primary major) with a diploma listing: "B.A. or a B.S. with a major in \_\_\_\_\_ and a major in \_\_\_\_\_..."
  - b. Choosing a BAS, with a diploma listing: "Bachelor of Arts and Sciences with a major in \_\_\_\_\_ and a major in \_\_\_\_\_..."
3. The existing option of creating a formal dual degree program would remain.
4. The second degree rules would be amended to include the stipulation of at least 27 unique credits in each major.

The committee asked Alan Lamborn to discuss the ease with which such a policy could be implemented by the Registrar's Office.
