Effective Date

FSHN 504 03(3-0-0). Micronutrients. S. Prerequisite: Admission to GP-IDEA program in dietetics. Offered only as an online course.

Spring Semester 2009

Coordination of structure and function related to metabolic needs as a basis for evaluating micronutrient needs in normal or altered metabolic states. (NT-O)

FSHN 505 03(3-0-0). Nutrition and Physical Activity in Aging. S. Prerequisite: Admission to GP-IDEA program in dietetics. Offered only as an online course.

Spring Semester 2009

Physiological changes during aging and impacts on health and disease; focus on successful aging with emphasis on physical activity and nutrition. (NT-O)

All of the courses, with the exception of FSHN 520, will only be offered at a distance. All of the courses are to be part of a distance dietetics option in the master of science in nutrition and food science, currently under review by the Committee on Scholarship, Research, and Graduate Education.

Request to Drop Concentrations in Speech Communication

Requests by the Department of Speech Communication to drop the concentrations in communication studies, media studies, and rhetorical studies were approved. The recommended effective date is Fall Semester 2008.

A request to change the remaining concentration, teacher licensure, to an option under the major is currently being prepared by the department. It will be considered at a later date by the committee.

Request to Change the Name of the Undergraduate Major in Speech Communication

A request by the Department of Speech Communication to change the name of the undergraduate degree (B.A.) in speech communication to communication studies was approved. The recommended effective date, subject to special action by Faculty Council and approval by the Board of Governors and the Colorado Commission on Higher Education, is Fall Semester 2008.

Request to Drop Review Course Statement

A request by the Department of Human Dimensions of Natural Resources to drop the following review course statement for the parks and protected area management concentration in the major in natural resource recreation and tourism (B.S. degree program) was approved.
