SETTING UP AN ETHERNET CONNECTION ON YOUR MACINTOSH COMPUTER

Before starting this process, be sure to have the following items:

1. Mac OS 8.1 or higher is installed on your computer.
2. An Ethernet card is physically installed into the computer.
3. An Ethernet cable is connected to your Ethernet card and to the Ethernet jack in your wall.

Step 1: Set AppleTalk to use Ethernet

Under the Apple Menu in the upper left hand corner, select *Control Panels | AppleTalk*

Under *Connect via*: Select "Ethernet".

Current zone: Will be set automatically.

Close the **AppleTalk** window.

When prompted to *Save*, click on the **Save** button.



Step 2: Set TCP/IP

Under the Apple menu in the upper left hand corner, select *Control Panels | TCP/IP*



Connect via: Select "Ethernet"

Configure: Select "Using DHCP Server"

DHCP Client ID: Leave blank.

In the *Name server addr* box type: **129.82.100.64** (Press Enter)

Then type: **129.82.103.75**

In the *Additional Search domains* box, type: **colostate.edu**

Close the **TCP/IP** window.

When prompted to save, click on the **Save** button.

Step 3: Connect to the Internet

You can now connect to the Internet and can start using Internet applications such as Netscape or Internet Explorer.
