# Journalism Course Work Requirements

**Note: Students must take A-E in Conceptual Foundations (15 credits) and A-F in one concentration (G and other requirements in CMC) for a total of 33-40 JT credits. Students are required to take the capstone course in their chosen concentration, regardless of whether they are taking another capstone in a different major. All students are encouraged to take a 2-3-credit journalism internship.**

**Students are also required to complete a 21-credit Option Area, in an area outside Technical Journalism. The Option Area must be “unique”, that is, courses which are not used to fulfill other requirements. Specialized Communication has specific course requirements for the Option Area.
